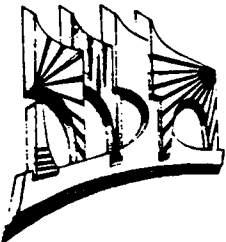
Children! A clown will be there to make up your face! Ladies, a make-over is waiting for you!

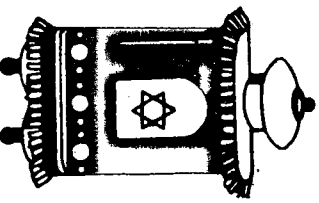
