Off the Bimah

It is the nature of congregants to educate their rabbis by sending books and reprints for us to read. (It is, by the way, greatly appreciated!) One of our members recently shared with me a jarring article entitled "Turmoil in the Temple," written by a noted American Jewish sociologist at Brandeis University. The author maintains that, despite the many wonderful things taking place in synagogues throughout the country (increased attendance, exciting and innovative educational programs, etc.), it is only a camouflage for the "ugly scenes that occur all too frequently." In this category he includes political infighting, telephone networking to spread rumors, character assassinations, frequent meetings when issues give way to personalities, and uncivilized fighting over finances, buildings and grounds.

The article is excessively negative and cynical. Beth El is still a place where issues of right and wrong, good and bad, are legitimately grappled with and where we labor collectively on behalf of a religious institution guided by loftier principles than Roberts Rules of Order. But the article is a helpful reminder that, even in our congregation, we must occasionally pause and evaluate our ways of doing business and that our behavior must always be judged in consultation with the morals and constraints of our tradition. It is wrong to embarrass people in public and it is wrong to spread rumors that can damage another's reputation. These methods have no place in a Jewish house of worship.

Are You Current?

Dues are overwhelmingly the largest source of funds to keep Beth El open and running. Beth El operates on a July 1 - June 30 fiscal year. As members, we have obligated ourselves, at a minimum, to make quarterly payments of all required fees and assessments (dues, building fund, tuition). The first quarterly payment is due by September 15 or 10 days prior to Rosh Hashanah, whichever is earlier. By December 31, 1990, a minimum of 50% of your bill should have been paid. An additional 25% of the total is due by March 31 and all current year charges must be paid by June 30. Members having special financial agreements with the Financial secretary are considered current so long as they meet the terms of their individual agreements. If you are having trouble remembering this schedule, consider paying your remaining balance now. Should you have any specific questions about your bill, please call Carole Lintz, the synagogue's bookkeeper, during regular business hours.

From the President

At the midyear point in our fiscal year, the Board has taken a comprehensive look at our income and expenses. When we project our income and expenses for the rest of the year, even with cost saving measures, we will be running at a deficit unless we can generate more income.

Each of you can make a very big difference. You can keep current in your dues, school tuition, and building fund. You can make extra contributions if you are able. You can use Giant, Magruder's, and Shalom certificates for all your shopping at these stores. Remember, you can use these certificates for prescriptions, film developing, wine, beer, liquor, and cosmetics as well as groceries. If one-third of our members used \$200 worth of certificates a month, we would eliminate our deficit. Certificates are easy to obtain - you can get them at the synagogue office, from the Religious School when picking up or dropping off your children, from the Nursery School, from the Gift Shop, or, in many cases, we can arrange to have them delivered or mailed to your home. Place a standing order - help us eliminate the deficit without it costing you anything additional. If you want more information about certificates, call Claire Marwick at 301-657-2328. Please remember, the certificates are not tax deductible. The IRS is checking carefully.

Although we all have to work hard to help eliminate the deficit, there is much that is positive to report. One of the reasons we are running at a deficit is because we are so successful. Our programming is superb - we have programs and activities for every age. Our facilities are in constant use - we are a vibrant, growing synagogue. We want to maintain our high level of activities and programming. We want to continue to serve you in the best way we can but we can't do this without money. Help Beth El in whatever way you are able.

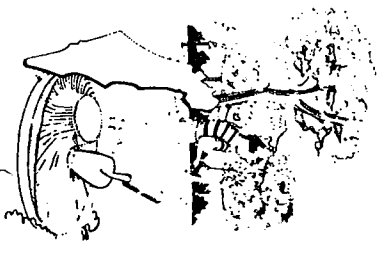
