## Off the Bimah

Your reactions to the case study on intermarriage that I presented last month were immediate and they were forthcoming. Some commented on parallels to their own lives, marriages, and backgrounds; others expressed concern as to the synagogue's sensitivity (or lack of sensitivity) to mixed married couples; still others made concrete suggestions on approaching the issue practically within the congregational family. My conclusion is that we must acknowledge our shortcomings in this area and attempt to move forward. In a recent issue of the journal "Conservative Judaism," suggestions were brought forward towards work developing a truly successful Keruv (Outreach) Program. These include:

1. A regular bulletin column addressing concerns of the intermarried.
2. An Outreach Committee to work with and create programs for intermarried couples, children of intermarried couples, and parents of intermarried couples.
3. An Outreach Shabbat.
4. Publicity efforts to communicate with our members about policies and programs for the intermarried.

These suggestions have been made to help stimulate a process. We have much to learn from our Reform brothers and sisters already working in the field. This is a key challenge for the synagogue and the Jewish community of the 90's.

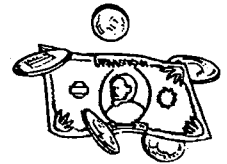
This meeting will also include the election of next year's officers. Babysitting is available by calling Elizabeth Bauer at 301-654-8321 if you need this service.

### Shopping Certificate News

1. Shaul and Hersel's rebates 5%. It works this way: When you shop there, identify yourself as a Beth El member. The cashier will write "Beth El" on the reverse side of your cash register tape. Then bring or send the tape to the Beth El office (mark it Shaul and Hersel's). We will take it to the store and receive a 5% rebate.
2. We now have Shoppers Food Warehouse certificates in \$10 and \$25 denominations.
3. **Important:** Sisterhood is overseeing the shopping certificate program, but, please note: 90% of the proceeds - which averages \$500 a week - goes to the Beth El General Fund. The other 10% goes to support Sisterhood activities such as Shabbat Kiddushim, Israel scholarships for our teens, the Jewish Theological Seminary, and purchasing kitchen equipment.
4. Our warmest thanks to the approximately 400 families who have bought certificates at least once; many are regulars.
5. We make it very easy and convenient for you to purchase certificates. There are three options available:
  - a. Certificates are available at Beth El in the synagogue office, on the Religious School carpool line, at the Nursery School, during meetings and functions (Sisterhood and Men's Club meetings, Board meetings, Vatikim lunches, Saul Bendit classes, etc.), and in the Gift Shop.
  - b. As you know, we do deliver to your home if it is inconvenient for you to purchase at Beth El. We are grateful to new "assistants" Bea Breger, Betty Goldberg, Laurie Lewis Leager, Helene Papilsky, and Cheryl Rod who have offered to telephone for and/or deliver certificates.....Anyone else out there willing to lend a hand?
  - c. You can also purchase certificates without leaving your home. Mail your order with a check made payable to Beth El Sisterhood to the synagogue office (mark your envelope "Shopping Certificates") and we will send your certificates by return mail.
