Tuning In with Cantor Lubin

It is in the nature of human beings to take for granted that which they possess and to not always appreciate fully, or even be aware of, the gifts which are theirs. It is only when others make us aware, that we begin to recognize our special gifts and blessings and indeed our very rich cultural heritage.

During the course of the class that I recently taught at our Saul Bendit Adult Institute, namely "The Yiddish Folk and Art Song," it became quickly apparent how precious a repertory of Jewish song we have inherited in these gems that stem from the hearts and souls of our grandparents and ancestors of the East European shtetl.

As I was preparing and researching materials for this class, I discovered that a number of well-known non-Jewish composers were aware of this rich and colorful repertoire of the Yiddish folksong and expressed themselves in most admiring and lofty statements regarding the beauty and quality of these songs.

I want to share with you several of these sentiments that have been documented:

Rimsky-Korsakoff once turned to his Jewish students at the St. Petersburg Conservatory and said: "Why do you imitate European and Russian composers? The Jews possess tremendous folk treasures. I myself have heard your religious songs, and they have made a deep impression upon me. Think about it. Yes, Jewish music awaits her Jewish Glinka."

Dmitri Shostakovich wrote his Symphony #13 as a setting of Yevtushenko's poetic account of the tragic events at Babi Yar, the wartime mass grave of thousands of Soviet Jews. He is quoted to have said: "Jewish folk music had made a most powerful impression on me. I never tire of delighting in it. It is multifaceted; it can appear to be happy, while it is tragic. It's almost always laughter through tears."

Maurice Ravel, who arranged a setting of the traditional Kaddish melody and a Yiddish folk song, once wrote: "I was attracted to the strange and haunting beauty of Jewish music. I felt, almost, as though I had been brought into a new musical world when a few authentic Jewish melodies were brought to my notice. I was so bewitched by the mysterious color and exotic charm of these melodies that for weeks I could not let this music out of my mind. Then my imagination was set aflame."

Others have praised our heritage. Let us rediscover it and cherish it.

Cantor Lubin to Sing at National Convention in L.A.

Cantor Abraham Lubin was invited to participate in a major concert of cantorial classics and Yiddish folk songs during the annual Cantors Assembly Convention which was held in Los Angeles from May 5-9.

The Cantors Assembly is the international organization of professional cantors affiliated with the Conservative Movement. Its members serve congregations in the United States and Canada as well as Europe and Israel.

Cantor Lubin presently serves as Secretary of the Cantors Assembly and is the Treasurer-Elect of this organization.

The convention will include concerts, symposia on various aspects of liturgical, folk, and art music, and sessions on the role of the Hazzan in the modern American synagogue.

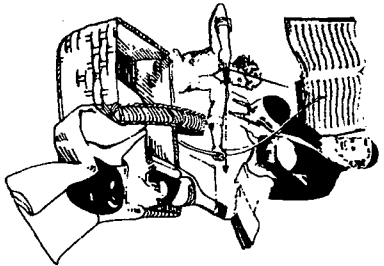
