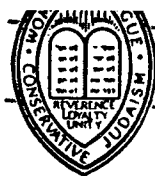

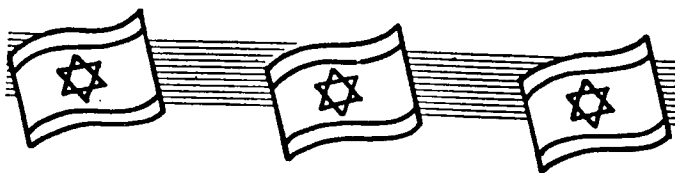

The Israel Trip Continued

Since the trip I was on was sponsored by United Synagogue, we visited a number of Masorti (the Conservative Movement worldwide) institutions. Among those we visited were Moshav Soroshim, Kibbutz Hanaton, and Neve Hanna.

Moshav Shoroshim is in the Galilee about 13 miles from the Lebanese border. The majority of the members are English-speaking, from the United States and Canada, university graduates, and grew up as active members of USY. The moshav was started in 1980 but spent five years at other settlements waiting for the development of roads and other facilities. They moved into the present site in 1985 and officially joined the Masorti movement shortly thereafter. The moshav economy is based on high tech industry. They have invented and are selling some extremely sophisticated equipment. The moshav has 31 families with a total of 90 children. They are socially and financially very stable. Salary is based on the size of the family and age of the children. Observance varies between families but it is basically Conservative. Shabbat and Holidays are celebrated together. The moshav welcomes qualified families.

Kibbutz Hanaton is in the lower part of the Western Galilee. There are 80 adults and 40 children on the kibbutz. The adults consist of families as well as young people from the Masorti Youth Movement, Noam, serving in the Nahal unit of the Army. The members are from the United States, Canada, South Africa, Chile, Holland, France, and Ireland. The religious life at Hanaton is within the Conservative framework. Hanaton's economy is agricultural - milk from their sheep is sold to make cheese, they raise chickens for sale and grow tomatoes. They have just planted grapefruit trees. Their Educational Center develops and provides programs for youths and adults. The kibbutz welcomes new members.

Neve Hanna is a home for abused children. Neve Hanna tries to duplicate a family unit. It is very unique in this respect and hopes to build an institute to train counselors to do this. There are 56 children in five group homes. The children in the homes range from 4-14 years of age and there is one home just for teenagers. The day care center serves an additional 20 children. Until recently, 50% of the funds came from the government with the remainder coming from voluntary contributions. Now the government will only be contributing 25%. Clearly, the voluntary contributions will have to increase.

These Masorti institutions often do not get the support from the government that similar Orthodox institutions get. If you are considering donating money to Israel, target your money for Conservative institutions by donating through the Foundation for Masorti Judaism - these donations can be handled through Beth El.

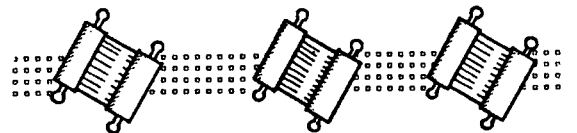

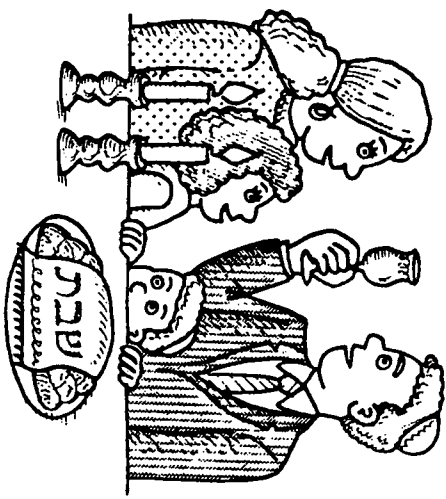
