Bethesda, MD (AP) -- Officials of Congregation Beth El have announced that this year the annual garage sale, popularly known as the **BETH ELEPHANT SALE**, will resume its traditional place on the calendar, namely, the Labor Day Weekend, from Sunday, September 1 to Monday, September 2.

When the doors last opened for this popular fund-raising event (January 21, 1991), the All-Purpose Room was bursting with anxious customers. Four hours and 900 shoppers later, Beth El had raised almost \$5,000 for its general operating fund.
