FROM THE PRESIDENT

The High Holy Days are now over and they already seem like they are a long time ago. Before Yom Kippur I couldn't wait until it was over, but once it was I miss it. The afternoon of Yom Kippur is my favorite time - the afternoon sun comes in through the Synagogue windows and I feel a little light headed, not especially hungry or thirsty, but very spiritual. All my worldly problems are forgotten and I'm ready to start the new year with a new focus and less of a burden of small, unimportant annoyances. I'm sorry this doesn't last until next Yom Kippur. In fact, it barely lasts a few days. Luckily Succot comes right along to lift up one's spirit.

Unfortunately those of you who were at Einstein High School for Yom Kippur had the extra challenge of a very warm Kol Nidre. I know it is not much of a consolation, but other Synagogues using County Schools had the same problem this year. However, we were able to mitigate the problem for Yom Kippur Day due to the efforts of Harry Pitt and Steve Kravitz. We apologize for disturbing them on Kol Nidre Night and we thank them for getting us those fans that made it much more comfortable at Einstein.

I would like to give special thanks to Beryl Frank, Max Krents and Pat Danoff and her children, for helping to set up Einstein on short notice. Also on short notice extra effort was made by Tamar Fishman and Rabbi Samuel Fishman to decorate the stage with her art work. It helped turn the auditorium into a "Shul".

Our services were an inspiration thanks to our Rabbis Maltzman and Rudolph, whose sermons were outstanding. Thanks

to our Hazzonim Lubin and Zymelman for leading the services so splendidly. Cantor Lubin, of course, we get to enjoy throughout the year; but during the High Holidays my personal favorite is his rendition of "Hineni".

Our heartfelt appreciation goes to all of those who were so generous in their response to our Rosh Hoshanah Beth El Appeal. Thanks to Morris Sedaka, Beryl Frank, Max Krents and Allan Mendelowitz, who made phone calls to help get pledges. We received 124 pledges for approximately \$30,000. Your help and generosity will provide the extra support needed for our Beth El programs.

Beth El members, in response to the Israel Bond Drive, under the direction of Cary Feldman, were also very supportive of Israel's needs and surpassed last years record of contributions.

We have a debt of gratitude to many of our congregants for helping us. Max Bernhardt, who along with Steve Kravitz, had overall responsibility for the arrangements of the High Holy Day Services did an excellent job. I also want to thank our head ushers Elliott Robinson and Herb Levinson and all the ushers for keeping the decorum, thus making the services pleasant for all of us.

All those who helped to send out tickets and to those who helped by staffing our offices after hours so that people would have an opportunity to get tickets for the services - thank you. There were many more Beth El volunteers that help to make the High Holy Day Services pleasurable for all of us and we appreciate.

To start out the New Year, I would like to ask you, the Congregants, to help us on what I consider three very important mitzvot:

1. Bob Gerwin, the chairman of the Chevra Kadisha needs more volunteers to help provide all the services required from "Shomrim" (Watchpersons) to helping with phone calls and other tasks. Please call him or the office if you can give us a hand.

2. I have asked Michele Herman to chair a committee in response to Rabbi Maltzman's sermon about the need to provide hospitality for congregants, students away from home, or visitors that would otherwise be alone during the Jewish holidays and Shabbat.

3. Herbert Wiser made what I think is a very good suggestion. We have been having a problem getting a minyan together some evenings, and he recommended that those people that have yartzheit during the week should not only attend the night they say Kaddish, but also on at least two other nights so that everyone saying Kaddish will be assured of a minyan.

It is very disappointing when someone needs to say Kaddish and there isn't a minyan. Please make every effort to attend the evening minyan when your time is designated in the Scroll.

I hope to see you at Beth El on the holidays and Shabbat before next Rosh Hoshanah. As they say down in Texas, "Yo'll Come".

FROM THE MAILMAN

Dear Mr. Groner:

Recently I returned home from a wonderful six week stay in Israel. I went on a USY Israel Pilgrimage. We travelled all around Israel, as far north as Lebanon, and as far south as Egypt.

The traditional observances of Conservative Judaism played a major role in the trip. We davened two, and sometimes three times a day, and we said Birkat Hamazon after each meal. I learned how to correctly lay T'fillin. For the most part, we were Shomer Shabbat, and we kept Kosher. One Shabbat I prayed at the Kotel, and two other Shabbats were spent at the Jerusalem Great Synagogue. I had a wonderful time in Israel and it was truly an enriching Jewish experience. I might not have been able to go on the trip had it not been for the generous scholarship which the Synagogue gave to me.

This trip made me, and probably many of the other pilgrims, more conscious of Israeli problems in the Middle East. We learned much modern Israeli history since 1948, but that was tied in with many lectures we had on ancient history, such as Masada, and the whole period with the Romans.

In my opinion, every Jewish teenager should have the opportunity to have such an experience. I would be willing to promote this trip within the Congregation. Thank you for enabling me to have this kind of experience.
