Off the Bimah

In the 13th century Rabbi Moses ben Nahman wrote a beautiful ethical treatise entitled: "Iggeret Ha-Kodesh" which deals with the beauty and wonder of human sexuality. The author, Chief Rabbi of Catalonia, Spain, is known by his acronym: The Ramban. His writings attest to the fact that we have not been free of ambivalence towards human sexuality. At the same time, he addresses two fundamental questions: What is the Jewish view of sexual relations? How are we to conduct ourselves in our most intimate lives? Though referring to sexual abuses in his time, and to the marriage relationship in particular, his words are a necessary reminder today of the need for greater sensitivity between men and women in the workplace and beyond. Judaism tells us that freedom of will and action must be fully acknowledged and respected. This is the ultimate meaning of love and sexuality. We should heed the Ramban's words: "The wonder of the man includes his being the mystery of wisdom, and the female is the mystery of understanding. . . Be calm and gentle as you enter the path of love and will."

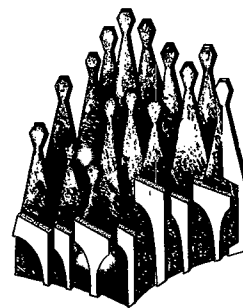
Use Merchandise Certificates When You Shop!!!!!!

Tuning in with Cantor Lubin

History records its events and paints its canvas of the human condition in the most remarkably astonishing strokes and with the most incredible twists.

Spain, which historians tell us, has been a haven for Jews ever since the destruction of the second Temple in Jerusalem, almost 2000 years ago; Spain which had been conquered by Moslem Arabs in the year 711 and had left a lasting Moorish cultural influence there, during the centuries of their sojourn; this same Iberian country is now host, once again, to Arabs and Jews as they attempt to negotiate a peace agreement between them, for their benefit and for the ultimate benefit of the entire world.

All this is happening on the eve of the quincennial anniversary year of the expulsion of the Jews from Christian Spain.

Is this confluence and bond of Spaniard, Arab and Jew a mere coincidence of historical reality? Is it too naive or whimsical to suggest that perhaps we are witnessing a beautiful symbol of spiritual reality, in that Christian, Moslem and Jew can and, indeed, must learn to live in harmony if a true and lasting peace is to be achieved in Madrid? The triangle of the three major faiths of Christianity, Islam and Judaism is now being tested in the crucible of history.

Let us all hope and pray that this historic Middle East peace conference which began its deliberations in a land which centuries ago enjoyed a Golden Age of Jewish religious and cultural creativity as well as perpetrated its tragic end with the expulsion of Jews from Spain, will once again yield accord, harmony and a lasting peace to Jews and Arabs and the entire world community.

(On Sunday April 26, 1992 we at Beth El will premiere a newly commissioned musical work which will celebrate the Golden Age of Spanish Jewry and commemorate the 500th "Yahrzeit" of the expulsion of Spanish Jewry).

Cantor Lubin Sings in Memorial Concert in New York

Cantor Abraham Lubin recently participated in a Memorial Concert dedicated to the memory of one of this Century's greatest Hazzanim, Cantor Mordechai Hershman. The occasion was the 50th Yahrzeit of this master Hazzan.

The concert was held in the famed Temple Beth El of Borough Park in Brooklyn, New York where Mordechai Hershman served as its Hazzan for ten years. Prior to Hershman's arrival to the United States in 1920 he served as the "Shtot Hazzan" Chief Cantor of Vilna.
