Off The Bimah

In my earliest conversations with representatives of this Congregation I was questioned as to my perception of a rabbi's role in fundraising. In a capital project, one to which I was committed - I assured them - I would lend whatever moral support I could. Though raising funds is not my forte', I have participated intimately in this current effort to refurbish our sanctuary because of its necessity and importance. Uncomfortable, and somewhat tentative at first, I have personally reached out to many of you to ask for your help and support.

One of my earliest calls was instructive. I started my appeal with an apology. The person at the other end, an accomplished fund raiser in her own right, chided me for beginning with the words: "I'm sorry.... You are not asking for yourself, but for our synagogue," she told me, "and you mustn't react personally to rejection."

There have been many highs and a few lows in this effort. I have been impressed with the dedication of Benson Adams, the professionalism of Peter Friedmann and their entire committee; I have been encouraged by the dignity of Beryl Frank, and inspired by those of you who have graciously, generously, and willingly given of your time and resources to our beloved synagogue. A special thanks to Dolly Band is in order as well.

One young physician and his spouse, parents of two small children, didn't hesitate to offer a substantial gift. He called on the example of his parents in Norfolk who have been generous contributors to their own Congregation, which he witnessed as a child. "I'm continuing a family tradition....by giving," he told me.

May we all set similar examples of altruism and goodness in this and all other worthwhile endeavors.

Book of the Mensch Club - Family Reading Program

The Book of the Mensch Club is designed to encourage you and your children to read and discuss books with some Jewish content. Children of all ages may participate and, if they choose to submit a book review, are eligible to receive one of three \$100 gift certificates. To help you start your family's reading program, the Board of Jewish Education provides a clearly written, useful "Parent Information Kit" which includes a guide to choosing books, questions to use during book discussions, ideas for book reviews, and a list of suggested reading (with titles ranging from familiar pictures to the Diary of Anne Frank and even Judy Blume books). Beth El's library and the local public libraries are both good sources for the suggested books and books of your own choosing. Look in your child's bookbag for the Parent Information Kit or ask your child about the program. It's an exciting way to bring Judaism into your daily life.

Dear Keruv: My in-laws are not Jewish. Is there any way they can participate in my daughter's bat mitzvah? — Planning Ahead.

Dear Planning: Yes! We want your entire family to feel welcome in our synagogue and be part of your daughter's Bat Mitzvah. Although ritual honors like receiving an aliyah or opening the ark must be reserved for Jews, your in-laws' presence may be recognized from the bimah and they may say a prayer or read in English from the bimah.

Then there are liability issues and potential discipline problems that our school, teachers, and your child's classmates should not be subjected to. Do not misconstrue my message, guests will always be made to feel welcome. The bottom line condition is that we be given the courtesy of advance notice.
