## Dear Keruv

Dear Keruv: Out of a concern to be "politically correct" and approve of marriages between Jews and non-Jews, you minimize the "traditionally correct" viewpoint of Judaism, which I have been taught was that for the sake of our covenant with God, for the sake of our history and for the sake of our future, the ideal marriage for a Jew is to another Jew.

I am particularly concerned that your column has taken upon itself to imply that "Congregation Beth El believes the opposite." In an official Beth El bulletin it seems highly inappropriate that Dear Keruv should state what Beth El believes. If Rabbi Maltzman, President Groner, or Steven Kravitz want to state what "Beth El believes" that is their prerogative. For Dear Keruv to take such matters into its own hands is another. Until Rabbi Maltzman is willing to state what "Beth El believes" or until the Congregation votes at a meeting what it "believes" about the very sensitive subject of marriage outside the faith, I think it inappropriate for any component of the synagogue to claim to speak for the synagogue.

One purpose of Keruv may be to help intermarried couples to feel good. But as a somewhat traditional Jew, I would hate for the price of "feeling good" about a synagogue to mean the abandonment of the ideal of the Jewish family. I am well aware

that our "real world" prevents the formation of an ideal Jewish family in too many cases. But if the synagogue, if our synagogue, does not state, unequivocally, that marriage within the faith is the ideal building block of future strength, then why should any member care if someone does differently? Why should our children keep the faith?

I welcome the work of Keruv if its goal is to encourage all Jews to recognize that Jews who convert are full members of the Jewish community. I welcome the work of Keruv, if its goal is to bring non-Jewish spouses and fiancé(s) into the synagogue with the intention of encouraging conversion, of making the commitment to Judaism and the Jewish people that others have made by choice or have been challenged with by birth.

The Dear Keruv column recently implied that those who disagree with its ideas may be "prejudiced." I can only speak for myself. Let all who are willing to be full members of our community join us and be full members. Let all who are considering membership in our community be welcomed with open arms. Let all who are not members of the community but married to members of our community know how much we want them to become full members of the community. But do not consider these viewpoints to be "prejudice." If being part of a synagogue represents not just a social activity, but also a theological commitment, it is not unreasonable to appeal relentlessly for such commitment.

Dear Dr. Oren: Thank you for your thoughtful letter which introduces a much-needed dialogue about Keruv's role in the synagogue.

Keruv tries to respond to the needs of Beth El families affected by intermarriage, but we do not encourage intermarriage - it is a difficult balance. We do encourage these interfaith families and especially their children to be Jewish in a meaningful way at Beth El.

We consult Rabbi Maltzman before each Keruv column is written, and he reads each one before it is printed in the Beth El Scroll. We will continue to consult him.

The earlier article's reference to prejudice applied to those who would shut out of the synagogue converts, their children, and those trying to discover Judaism, not those who welcome the modern ger and gioret tzedek. We are sorry you took offense.

We welcome you to our meetings to share your ideas, experience, and knowledge. We need the varied points of view of Beth El's congregants as we meet the issues intermarriage brings to Beth El.

Keruv ("outreach") was formed to address the issues that intermarriage brings to Beth El. Address your questions to Dear Keruv in care of the synagogue office -- or join our monthly meetings to share your experiences with or concerns about intermarriage. 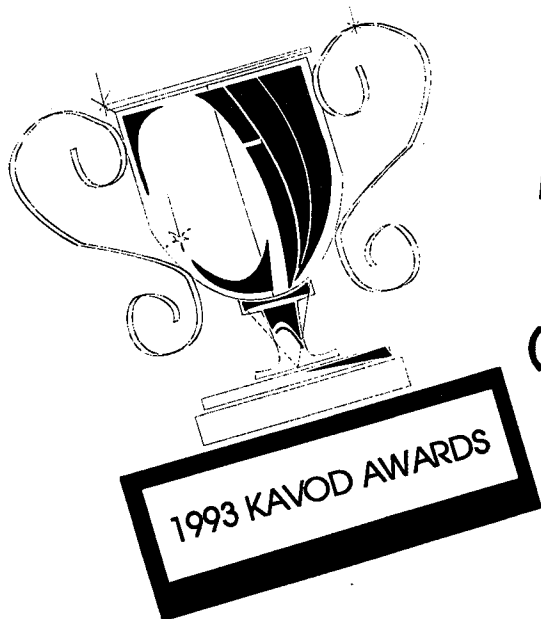
