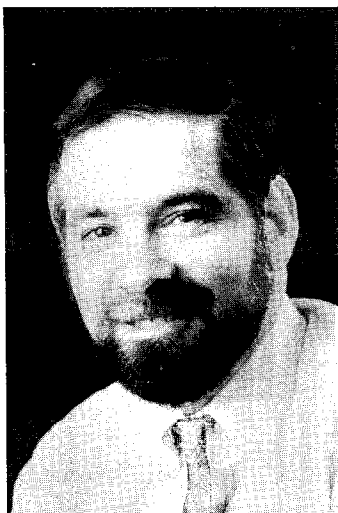

Arthur S. Feld Memorial Lecture - June 19th

The Arthur S. Feld Memorial Lecture will feature a lecture and discussion led by Dr. Michael Berenbaum, project director of the United States Holocaust Museum in Washington, DC and the Hymen Goldman Professor of Theology at Georgetown University. Dr. Berenbaum has also served as director of the Jewish Community Council of Greater Washington, Opinion-Page editor of the Washington Jewish Week and deputy director of the President's Commission on the Holocaust under President Carter, where he authored the *Report of the President*, which recommended the establishment of the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, DC.

"The World of Yossele Rosenblatt" Reprise

His presentation on the NBC television program "Religion and the White House" earned him the Silver Angel Award of the National Association of Religious Broadcasters for the outstanding religious broadcasting program on television. A television documentary that Dr. Berenbaum co-authored with his wife, Lynda Bayer, "Holocaust, the Survivors Gather in Washington," was aired on PBS.

Dr. Berenbaum's lecture will be given during Shabbat morning services on June 19, 1993. Following the Kiddush, there will be a discussion period with the speaker along with questions and answers. Join us on June 19th for the lecture, discussion and a tribute to the late Arthur S. Feld.

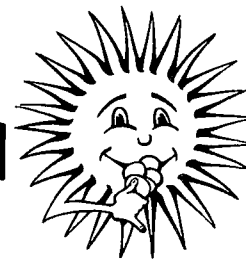
As the year comes to a close, we would like to welcome all the new Havurot which began this year. We wish them all success and encourage them to keep in touch with us if any needs arise.

Dear Keruv

Dear Keruv: You keep saying that the non-Jewish spouse in an intermarried family is welcome to participate in Jewish life at Beth El. Beyond going to services, what does this mean to my husband? Jewish Spouse.

Dear Jewish Spouse: The rule of thumb for your husband is that the non-Jewish spouse of a Beth El member may participate in any of the Beth El's activities with few exceptions: only Jews may receive ritual honors and only Beth El members may vote in Congregational meetings and hold office.

Almost every day, Beth El offers opportunities for your husband to participate in the life of the synagogue. There are too many to list individually, but here are a few ideas:

- after Shabbat services, stay for the Kiddush
- attend a social event - dinners, dances, concerts, Purim carnivals and baseball trips
- help out at one of your children's youth events (from Nitzanim and Bonim to USY)
- go to an evening holiday service -- each one has a different and special feeling
- join a havurah
- attend Men's Club events for camaraderie and fine speakers (Sisterhood, too)
- attend a class (one of the Saul Bendit classes on an array of Jewish-related topics, or another, like Israeli dancing)
- attend Junior Congregation (you can learn the structure of services and the prayers with guidance in English)

Participating in these events can give your husband a deeper understanding of what it means to be Jewish and how one lives a Jewish life, both of which can be mysterious and some-

times forbidding to a non-Jew. Although taking the first step may be difficult, there are sympathetic people who will help you if they know you are there. The spiritual and communal rewards of participation are great and we welcome your husband to Jewish life at Beth El.

Keruv ("outreach") was formed to address the issues that intermarriage brings to Beth El. Address your questions to Dear Keruv in care of the synagogue office -- or join our monthly meetings to share your experiences with or concerns about intermarriage. From the Principal

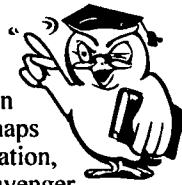
We are swiftly coming to the end of an excellent year of growth for our school. We have grown in student population from 280 students last year to 320 this year. Our faculty has grown to reflect this growth and also in response to interest in special classes. We have found stability in the school office with a new secretary, Carol Rubenstein. We have begun over a dozen initiatives that will make our program more interesting to our students and involving for our parents. And of course we have continued programs and activities begun last year and in years past. The development of a school is a constant, ongoing process. Every principal, school committee chair, teacher, parent and student makes a mark on the institution causing zigs and zags along the way to a never quite final product.

Of the more outstanding changes to the program it is in the growth of the upper school that I am most pleased. Our upper school program proved highly popular as measured by feedback throughout the year, attendance and those most effective measures - teacher and student enthusiasm.

Other significant developments included: The revised approach to teaching tefillah to the 4th-7th graders. Among the benefits to organizing classes according to performance levels was the possibility of many students progressing more rapidly than when forced to work in heterogeneous age-based classes. The first grade enrichment class, led through the second half of the year by Allison Redlich, attracted four students for a weekly experience of conversational Hebrew, Bible stories, music and arts and crafts. Rachel Albert, a product of our Religious School, returned to teach, B'Tzelem, our new special needs class. Tikkun Olam became a high profile feature of our educational plan with monthly activities involving learning experiences and contributions responding to a variety of needs, including Bosnian Jews and D.C.'s poor. The Vaad HaStudentim, Student Council, held its initial meetings guaranteeing student input into the operation of the school. Helping the school run more smoothly and facilitating communication with and between parents were the Parent Action Committee, the school Bulletin and the school Directory. I hope people are pleased with the growth of the school over this past year. It is surely the result of the cooperative effort of many hands. I invite all parents to be a part of the school process. The Parent Action Committee is one outlet, the School Committee is open to suggestions, and my door is always open.

From the Youth Director....

The Youth Department has had an extremely successful year. Beth El kids made maps of Israel out of ice cream, they toured a fire station, went skiing, had Shabbat dinners, went on scavenger hunts, and celebrated the holidays. It was a year packed full of excitement. Next year will be even better. If there are things you would like to do that we have not done this past year please call me at the office with your suggestions. I would love to hear them. I would like to thank the advisors of all the youth groups for their dedication, time, and effort in making the year an enjoyable one for Beth El youth. Bonim and Machar will each have one program in June. Programming for these groups will resume in September. Kadima and USY will meet periodically over the summer. Watch your mail for information. I hope everyone has a wonderful summer.

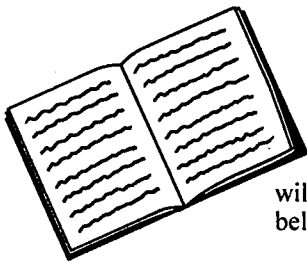
Beth El Kadima and USY Spring into Social Action

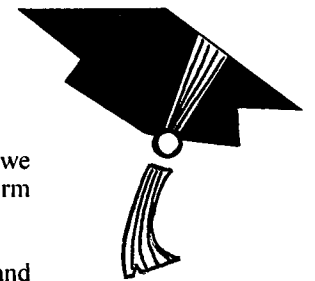
