Yahrzeit Plaques

Thanks to John Wolff, we now have a full accounting of all of our yahrzeit plaques. Each plaque is supposed to be lit on the Hebrew anniversary of the date of death. Our original card file system did not include all the plaques, and thus when we computerized our Yahrzeit system last winter, we only had 40% of the plaques entered. Therefore 60% of the plaques were not being lit on the appropriate day. Now, due to John Wolff's diligence and dedication, we can be assured that all the plaques will be lit on their Yahrzeit date.

Please be sure not to move your plaques, as we will lose track of them and they will not be lit. For any information regarding the Yahrzeit plaques or to order a new one, please contact Roz Daskal in the synagogue office.

Sukkah Building Kit or Do-It-Yourself Instructions

Sukkot begins this year on Wednesday night, September 29th. The Nitzanim Young Families group at Congregation Beth El has designed an easy-to-assemble, moderately priced Sukkah kit to enhance your enjoyment of the holiday.

The complete kit will produce a free-standing 8' x 8' x 8' square frame Sukkah made of #2 spruce. All necessary holes are pre-drilled and hardware (bolts, wing nuts, corner braces) and directions for assembly are included. Tools required are pliers, wrench, or nutdriver. You will need to provide your own siding (such as sheets, shades, or plastic), roofing branches, and decorations.

Pictures of the assembled Sukkah can be seen on the synagogue bulletin board near the office and in the Nursery School Hall. The Sukkah put up by the Nursery School is from a Nitzanim kit.

The cost of each complete kit is \$85 (which covers the cost of materials and a contribution to the synagogue). A limited number of kits are made during the summer and will be sold to the first people from whom we receive payment, so mail in your order soon to avoid disappointment!

For Do-It-Yourselfers:

An instruction packet including directions for purchasing the materials and completely making the Sukkah yourself is also available. We have plenty of copies and will mail them anywhere you wish.

The do-it-yourself instructions cost \$5 and include an exact shopping list of lumber and hardware needed, plus directions for how to cut the wood, drill the holes, and assemble the Sukkah.
