Through the kindness of a dear friend of my sister-in-law, I accompanied a small group of people who were escorted into the White House West Wing and Oval Office by a member of the President's Secret Service detail. We spent an entire hour gazing at the trappings of power and at the innermost sancta of our Executive branch. While the offices and corridors were smaller than I imagined, I experienced a thrill and an excitement that was memorable. Several days after our visit, Prime Minister Rabin and PLO Chairman Yassir Arafat walked the same corridors en route to the historic signing of mutual recognition. How dramatically things have changed was expressed to me by members of our congregation whose first child was born during the Gulf War and whose second child was born on the eve of this extraordinary occasion.

I join these parents and all of you in expressing my prayers that the two dreams - of Israel's security and a Palestinian entity - not prove to be mutually exclusive. I am immensely proud of the Israeli government. If there is eventually to be a genuine, lasting peace between these two peoples who have suffered so much, then your prayers and mine will one day be fulfilled.

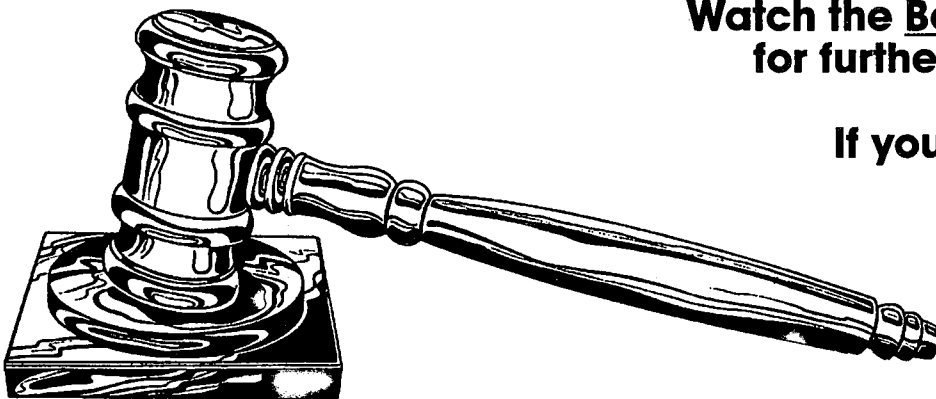

**Dear Keruv**

Dear Keruv: It seems to me that our sign "Adults should wear a head covering in the Sanctuary" is pretty clear and applies to non-Jews who visit our services. But what about the Tallit? Should non-Jews wear them in the Sanctuary? - Congregant

Dear Congregant: In the eyes of Jewish law, prayer shawls and kippot are completely different. Jewish men are commanded to wear tallitot in order to "remember the commandments of the Lord" and there is a blessing to recite while putting on the tallit. Because non-Jews are not expected to follow all the commandments placed upon Jews, they re not expected to wear tallitot and should not recite the blessing.

Believe it or not, the custom of wearing the kippah is not based on biblical or rabbinic law and there is no blessing associated with it. Unlike wearing the tallit, therefore, non-Jews are asked to wear kippot in the sanctuary to show their respect and conform to Beth El's custom.

Keruv ("outreach") was formed to address the issues of intermarriage at Beth El. Address your questions or comments to "Dear Keruv" in care of the synagogue office -- or join our discussion groups and other activities. 

## From the Principal

One of the highlights of my educational career came on the Monday afternoon of the historic treaty signing between Israel and the PLO. The fourth through seventh grade students of the religious school came together to talk about the remarkable events of the day and watch a videotape of the morning's ceremony. Fifth grade teacher Sarah Roark, who suggested the assembly, did the honors of leading the preliminary discussion introducing the key players in this event; foreign ministers, heads of state and national representatives. We then watched the speeches of President Clinton and Israel's Foreign Minister Shimon Peres. While fast forwarding the VCR through a few speeches to the actual treaty signing, music teacher Anita Schubert introduced peace songs in our tradition and led the group in singing Oseh Shalom. The 60 of us, students, teachers and parents then sang this centuries-old prayer for peace while watching Mahmoud Abbass, Shimon Peres and Warren Christopher sign this document that, God willing, will dramatically alter the course of history. That was the moment of that memorable day that I will never forget.

Personally, I line up with the optimists in my expected outcomes of this watershed event. Military conflict comes when the leaders of a nation choose to resolve issues through force of arms. War represents the breakdown of diplomacy. Just as the diplomacy between Israel and Egypt has gone through many difficult tests, this too will face awesome challenges. It is significant that this conflict was the heart of most of those trials anyway; for example: the Lebanon War and the recall of Egypt's ambassador. Reaching this stage of grappling with the issue has few parallels in modern diplomacy. Like last summer's mid-western floods, in the Palestinian-Israeli conflict, the flood of hope, expectation and anticipation has risen higher than the levees of hate, denial and malice that held them back. Now that the barriers have been breached, the force of the tides eventually erode the rest of the barrier until there is nothing to hold back the flow. Too much of promise has been held out to the Palestinians and the Israelis to accept anything less from their leaders than a peaceful resolution. There are too many people on both sides of this conflict with deep scars to casually accept a condition that would allow more wounds to be inflicted; not at this point. I look forward to the day when the rivalries between middle eastern states will be more a matter of who has the most powerful soccer team, the most highly trained symphony orchestra and the best equipped labor force. Oseh Shalom bimromav, Hu yaaseh shalom aleinu, v'al kol haolam, v'imru amein.
