Beth El and the Holocaust Museum Dedicated Congregational Wall to Lost Communities

As a tribute and as a memorial to the thousands of Jewish communities destroyed in the Holocaust, the United States

Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washingtron, D.C. dedicated its Congregational Wall in the Museum Donors Lounge. The wall is the centerpiece of the Museum's Congregational Campaign, whereby American synagogues pledge a \$50,000 gift in memory of specific synagogues destroyed by the Nazis.

To date, more than thirty American synagogues have supported the Museum — which was built solely through private donations — by sponsoring a gift in memory of destroyed congregations. Beth El was matched with Yagshto Street Hasidic Synagogue

in Kovno, Lithuania. The Hasidic congregation in Kovno was built in the 19th century when Kovno became a center of Jewish

cultural and religious activity in Lithuania. On June 25, 1941, as Einsatzgruppe A entered Kovno, Lithuanian collaborators staged

a pogrom in which 1500 Jews were killed. The Yagshto Street Synagogue (and other synagogues) went up in flames. Within a few months thousands of Kovno's Jews were shot by the Einsatzgruppen. Of the 40,000 Jews who were living in Kovno before the war, only 2,000 survived. Neither the Yagshto Street Synagogue building or community were rebuilt.

The plaque presented to Beth El is prominently displayed in the Beth El Board Room. Accepting the plaque on behalf of Congregation Beth El are Ellen Elow-Mintz, Jonathan Simon,

Rabbi Jonathan Maltzman, Leonard Bebchick, Judith Newman and Cary Feldman.

Shavuot

Shavuot will take place this year on May 16th and 17th. Literally, "the holiday of weeks," Shavuot marks the culmination of the 50-day counting period of the agricultural harvest — thus explaining its name Yom Ha-Bikkurim, the holiday of first fruits. Shavuot also has historical significance, since tradition states that the Torah was presented to the Jewish people on the 6th day of Sivan. For this reason, Shavuot is designated as Z'man Matan Toratenu — the time of giving our Torah.

Special Torah readings are assigned for these two days of Yom Tov — the highlight of which is the chanting of the Decalogue on the first morning, On the second day, Yizkor memorial prayers are said.

Shavuot is a triple holiday, a three-fold celebration which commemorates:

- *The giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai
- *The harvesting of wheat in Israel
- *The ripening of the first fruit in the Holy Land

The Rabbis declared Shavuot to be the most pleasant of all Jewish holidays. It complements Passover well and brings that great festival to a glorious conclusion. On Passover the Jews were freed from slavery, and on Shavuot the freed slaves were transformed into free human beings by the Ten Commandments.

Tuning In with Cantor Lubin

They say that "a little knowledge is a dangerous thing." Indeed, many of the ills of our society are the consequences of lack of knowledge or the confusion or distortion of facts. The following quotes are genuine student bloopers collected by teachers throughout the United States from eighth grade through college students. The quotes are from the article "56 B.C. and All That" by Richard Lederer in the National Review, March 1,1993. You may smile, but it is also a sad commentary.

"Ancient Egypt was inhabited by mummies, and they all wrote in hydraulics. They lived in the Sarah Dessert and travelled by Camelot. The climate of the Sarah is such that the inhabitants have to live elsewhere, so certain areas of the dessert are cultivated by irritation.
