Off The Bimah

Have you ever considered the powerlessness of words in the face of some grand experience: Can your description of a sunset ever match the inexhaustible majesty of a sunset? Can your description of your spouse, self, or best friend ever reveal every aspect of their personality? Can you ever adequately express what it feels like to hold a newborn baby? The scent, the softness, and the sweetness?

Several modern fields of learning are coming together to form the same insight - that is, that reality cannot be reduced to words. For example, psychology has an Object - Relations Theory which posits a realm where two people, or two things, can come together in a relationship that can only be experienced, never described in some "objective" way. Literary theory has "deconstructionism" which teaches that no matter how thoroughly you analyze a document, it always says more than what has been analyzed. In other words, the human mind can never adequately express in words the realities we encounter.

This is called ineffability - a truth so profound that it can't be pronounced. Why is reality ineffable? Judaism says this is because the universe is grounded in a God who transcends our mortal categories or our verbal expression.

We must always be prepared to open ourselves up a little more to experiencing the grandeur and the marvel and the mystery. We must open ourselves to experiencing the sacred and the holy. We must open ourselves to experiencing God.

Have You Discovered The Library?

Tucked in the corner between Rabbi Maltzman's office and the Chapel is one of the quietest spots in Beth El. A great place to study, read or just browse through magazines until your child's Religious School class ends. The Beth El library houses about 1500 volumes of Judaica, from Bible study and theology to Jewish history, music, cookery, art, travel, biography, literature, and Israeli politics. There are several shelves of children's books, and we subscribe to about 20 magazines and newspapers. New books are bought on a regular basis throughout the year; look at the blue-dotted books above the card catalogue to see what we have recently acquired.

Magazines are for use in the library only, but most books go out for three weeks. There are no fines, but we trust borrowers to return materials promptly.

The library is supported entirely by donations to the Library Fund. What better way to honor or remember a loved one than to support the collection of literature of the People of the Book?
