Board Talk

The following are highlights from the Board of Directors meeting on April 25, 1996.

President Suzanne Bronheim requested that more members of the congregation get involved in the space planning committees. Tamar Fishman has brought back the first of the two tapestry panels and she reports it is gorgeous. The second panel should be ready in about one year. Rabbi Maltzman has been named to the national board of Mazon.

Mark Weinberg presented the report of the Support Foundation. The Support Foundation proposed, and the Board approved, a change in the policy on the General Endowment fund. The new policy states that the Foundation will now distribute any capital gains of the General Endowment funds that are 4% over inflation up to the greater of \$10,000 or 25% of the net capital gains. At the same time, no distributions of interest and capital gains would exceed \$50,000 for any fiscal year.

Gary Bernstecker presented the FY 97 budget. The budget includes a 7.5% increase in dues and a 5% increase in school tuition, and we remain among the lowest cost Conservative shuls of our size in the area. Budget increases for next year include salaries, maintenance of the building, and other smaller expenses. The Board also approved the FY 97 budget. This will go to the May congregation meeting.

Congregants are reminded that the full minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors can be found outside the main office.

Family Education at Beth El Sarah Roark, Director of Family Education

How has the Family Education Program changed and expanded from last year? The primary difference between this year and last is that there are many more programs. We have averaged nearly two programs a month. At many grade levels there have been more than one program. The greater number of programs have provided a greater variety of content. It has also been possible to expand along a certain theme. Since the grant was first written, there has been a desire to merge aspects of social action and family education, thus strengthening both of these areas.

The family education programs tried to coincide with the monthly social action projects of the Religious School. The Tikkun Olam Fair, Kindergarten Mitzvah Day, two AIDS Awareness programs and Volunteering at National Capital Area Food Banks are all examples of putting mitzvot of social action to work.

There were many ways in which my being on staff this year rather than hired on a per program basis, as I was last year, was advantageous. I was available to attend monthly staff meetings and serve on committees. As a result, the Nursery School Director, Youth Director and I all worked together to produce the young families' megillah reading this Purim. I work most closely on a daily basis with the Religious School Director who feels that not only is the school enriched by family education programs, but that Religious School programs involving only the students have benefitted from my input and expertise. For

example, the Passover Activities Day was held on Sunday, March 25th for families with children ages five to nine. During mid-week Religious School, I organized a similar program for the students as the fifth grade teacher.

In addition to arranging social action experiences, another goal was to further educate families on ritual observance. Havdallah Happening, Passover University and the life cycle program on Death and Mourning were effective at highlighting specific features of ritual observance which could be directly applied in homes.

Families include more than one generation. One of the unique points of our grant was the stated desire to bring three generations into closer contact. Grandparents Junior Congregation was specifically set out to give grandparents a special Jewish opportunity to share with their grandchildren. At every program grandparents were encouraged to attend. In nearly every case we did have some grandparents in attendance, either in addition to or in place of the parents. At Kindergarten Mitzvah Day, a grandfather and a father showed the children how to put on tefillin. This is a concrete example of the older generation passing their knowledge on to the younger.

There is little question from speaking with parents and from written evaluations that the family education programs have made the parents feel more involved in their children's religious education. Parents with more than one child at different age levels may have attended as many as five programs. People appreciate being able to learn with their children. They also feel better informed about how religious education has made positive changes since they were in "Hebrew School." There is room for improvement both in the logistics of specific programs and the continued outreach to other groups in the synagogue.

Next year we hope to maintain some of the programs which were successful in the past two years. We also hope to continue to expand programs. One way of doing this expansion might be looking into programs which can be brought in from outside organizations. We had one such program this year; the ADL brought "Confronting Anti-Semitism." The Family Education Advisory Committee has brought together many interest groups from different areas of the synagogue to suggest improving the integrated participation of these groups. We hope to continue to find ways to meet the objectives of diverse groups. For example, we expect Family Education to be very involved in next year's project of writing a Torah.

Sample Programs

AIDS: Awareness and Response -- A speaker from Whitman Walker, an NIH physician spoke about AIDS prevention and advances in AIDS research. Followed by teacher led activities on Jewish mitzvot related to AIDS.

Havdallah Happening -- Parents and children separately learned about Havdallah symbolism. They then made or received the supplies to conduct the service and finally were led through Havdallah by the music teacher.

Familial Cancer in the Jewish Community -- Our Goal of 5,000 Volunteers Reached!

On April 30, 1996, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) completed the outreach phase of the Familial Cancer in the Jewish Community study. Due to the very strong support throughout the Jewish community, the first step of the study has been a tremendous success. During the eight weeks that participants were enrolled, over 5,000 men and women came forward and participated in this important National Institutes of Health study. This is an unprecedented response in health care studies!

The next phase of the study consists of careful analysis and comparisons of the anonymous blood samples and questionnaires. NIH is now beginning the rigorous analysis necessary to answer important questions about the impact of this genetic alteration to better understand the biology of cancer. This will advance work toward recommendations for prevention, detection and treatment. NIH anticipates the completion of the analysis by the end of the year and will share the results with the Jewish community.

Tucked in the corner between Rabbi Maltzman's office and the Chapel is one of the quietest spots in Beth El.
