## Notes From the Religious School Committee

We have come to the end of a busy and productive school year. Under the leadership of our Education Director, the Religious School Committee has overseen the development and expansion of a number of programs this year and addressed a variety of administrative, policy, operational and programmatic issues. Throughout the year, we have also tried to be responsive to parent, teacher and student concerns about safety, student behavior, curriculum and the educational program. By far the most challenging issue facing the School Committee this year involved the debate on religious school scheduling. Throughout a year-long study, the School Committee made every effort to consider the full range of views on this issue and the many complex factors affecting a decision. The School Committee was very appreciative of the outstanding effort by the Task Force on Session Times for Religious School chaired by Jerry Danoff. After serious and careful analysis of the Task Force report and comments by congregants (at an April meeting) as well as synagogue leadership, the School Committee decided that the Beth El Religious School would continue as a three-day, six-hour per week program in order to assure a comprehensive, quality educational program. This decision was affirmed by the Board of Trustees. The School Committee will strive to continue to enhance the educational program at Beth El and invites all Religious School families to participate in this ongoing effort.

I personally would like to thank the Beth El Religious School community for a very rewarding year as School Committee Chair. I know that Jonathan Levy, the new Chair of the School Committee, will enjoy your support as well and will do an excellent job in the coming year.

# SUKKAH BUILDING KIT

## ORDO-IT-YOURSELF INSTRUCTIONS

### ORDER EARLY THIS YEAR!

Sukkot begins this year on **Friday night, September 27th**. For the ninth year Congregation Beth El is offering an easy-to-assemble, moderately priced Sukkah kit to enhance your enjoyment of the holiday.

The complete kit will produce a free-standing 8' x 8' x 8' square frame Sukkah made of #2 spruce. All necessary holes are pre-drilled and hardware (bolts, wing nuts, corner braces) and directions for assembly are included. Tools required are pliers, wrench, or nutdriver. You will need to provide your own siding (such as sheets, shades, or plastic), roofing branches, and decorations.

Pictures of the assembled Sukkah can be seen on the synagogue bulletin board near the office and in the Nursery School Hall. The Sukkah put up by the Nursery School is from a Beth El kit.

**THE COST OF EACH COMPLETE KIT IS \$95 (which covers the cost of materials and a contribution to the synagogue). A limited number of kits are made during the summer and will be sold to the first people from whom we receive payment. MAIL IN YOUR ORDER SOON TO AVOID DISAPPOINTMENT SINCE WE ARE EXPECTING THE KITS TO SELL OUT AGAIN THIS YEAR.**

**For Do-It-Yourselfers:**

An instruction packet including directions for purchasing the materials and completely making the Sukkah yourself is also available. We have plenty of copies and will mail them anywhere you wish.

**THE DO-IT-YOURSELF INSTRUCTIONS COST \$6 and include an exact shopping list of lumber and hardware needed, plus directions for how to cut the wood, drill the holes, and assemble the Sukkah.**

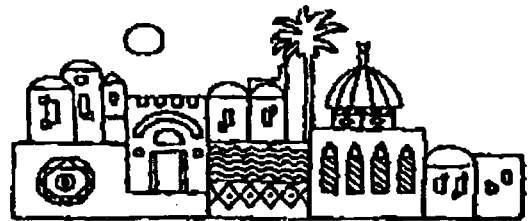
