Senior counselors (professional nursery school teachers) are complimented by teenage junior counselors and teenage volunteers help to ensure a safe and nurturing environment for the campers. The program which is filled to capacity this summer offers arts and crafts, water play, outdoor play, creative play and special events, ie. Lula's One Woman Circus, The Backpack Puppet Man, ImagineAction and Scales and Tales in addition to our usual celebration of Shabbat each Friday. The camp moves to "the beat of a drum" and the sound of laughter for six weeks of fun!

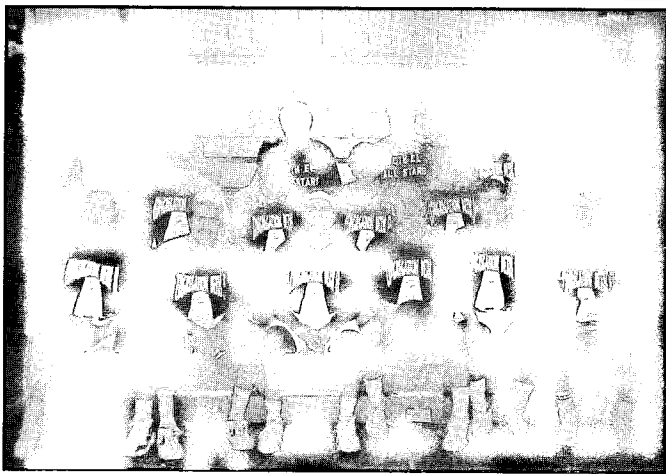

## Keruv

Rabbi Maltzman and Rabbi Rudolph have suggested that we use more Hebrew words that identify us as Jews. This summer, Keruv's columns have been devoted to words and phrases you may wish to incorporate into your Jewish vocabulary. This month, we offer the following list of greetings and responses:

**Shalom:** Peace. Greeting and response.

**Shalom aleichem:** Peace unto you. Greeting.

**Aleichem shalom:** Unto you, peace. Response to "Shalom aleichem." Yasheir koach (also koach, yi yasheir koach, or koach l'koach): variations of a blessing meaning "May you be strengthened." Usually said with a handshake to someone who has participated in a synagogue ritual.

**Baruch l'hiyeh:** Blessed may it be. Response to "Yasheir koach."

**Shvuah tov:** A good week. Greeting and response after Shabbat ends.

**Chag sameiach:** Happy holiday. Greeting and response on Purim, Hanukkah, Pesach, Shavuot and Sukkot.

**Yom Tov:** Good festival. Greeting and response on Pesach, Shavuot and Sukkot.

**Shana Tova:** A good year. Abbreviated greeting and response during the Days of Awe (Rosh Hashanah through Yom Kippur).

**Ge mar tov:** May you be sealed for good. Greeting used from Rosh Hashanah through Yom Kippur or to the end of Sukkot.

**Ge mar chatimah tova:** May you be sealed for good. Response to "Ge mar tov."

**Tzom kal:** (May you have) an easy fast. Greeting at Kol Nidre.

**SUKKAH BUILDING KIT**  
OR DO-IT-YOURSELF INSTRUCTIONS  
**ORDER EARLY THIS YEAR!**

Sukkot begins this year on Wednesday night, October 15th. For the tenth year Congregation Beth El is offering an easy-to-assemble, moderately priced Sukkah kit to enhance your enjoyment of the holiday.

The complete kit will produce a free-standing 8' x 8' square frame Sukkah made of #2 spruce. All necessary holes are pre-drilled and hardware (bolts, wing nuts, corner braces) and directions for assembly are included. Tools required are pliers, wrench, or nutdriver. You will need to provide your own siding (such as sheets, shades, or plastic), roofing branches, and decorations.

Pictures of the assembled Sukkah can be seen on the synagogue bulletin board near the office and in the Nursery School Hall. The Sukkah put up by the Nursery School is from a Beth El kit.

**THE COST OF EACH COMPLETE KIT IS \$95** (which covers the cost of materials and a contribution to the synagogue). A limited number of kits are made during the summer and will be sold to the first people from whom we receive payment. **MAIL IN YOUR ORDER SOON TO AVOID DISAPPOINTMENT SINCE WE ARE EXPECTING THE KITS TO SELL OUT AGAIN THIS YEAR.**
