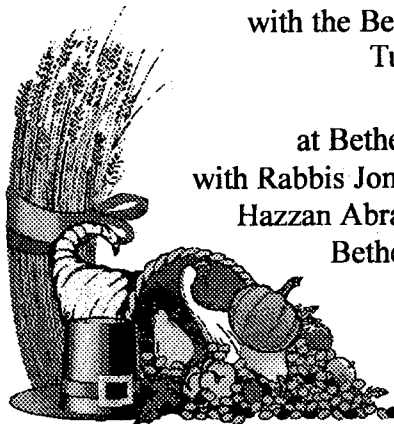

Have you started reading *Nice Jewish Girls* yet? This is a collection of stories, poems and memoirs written by Jewish women. You still have time since the next meeting of the Sisterhood Book Club is Sunday, December 7th at 9:30 a.m. in the Board Room. Here are two passages from the introduction: "The question this volume poses is this: What is it that makes a young woman a Jew?" The second quotation describes how the book is organized. "The Parts take their themes from the central Jewish prayer, the V'ahavta. The word 'v'ahavta' means 'love,' and the prayer defines the ways the Jewish people show love for God: Part One, 'with all your heart,' describes the first blush of contact with Jewish identity... Part Two, 'with all your soul,' is devoted to new spiritual territory ... Part Three, 'with all your might,' the identity crisis of adolescence and with it the sobering responsibilities of Jewish History... and Part Four, 'when you lie down, when you rise up,' our young women take their Jewish identities into the larger world." Evelyn Margolis, the Librarian at Beth El who also is a Librarian with the Montgomery County Public Library system, will lead the discussion. 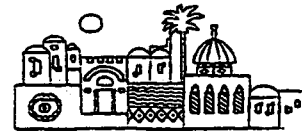
