Keruv

Dear Keruv: Because my son-in-law is not Jewish, I would like to provide as much support as possible for the Jewish upbringing of my grandchildren. Although they have decided to raise the children as Jews, they don't really have a lot of knowledge about how to do this. What can I do that will help them, despite the non-traditional family environment?

Answer: There are many things you and the other members of the family can do to support both the parents and children in their desire to have a Jewish family, assuming they are willing to accept your input. You can invite them to your home for holiday observances and Shabbat or go to their home and help them learn how to celebrate each holiday. You should encourage them to join a synagogue and have the children get a religious education even if they select a different stream of Judaism than how you raised your daughter. You can offer to take the grandchildren (and their parents) to synagogue with you on Shabbat. It will make it easier for your grandchildren if the entire family assists in this process and provides situations in which they can learn in a participatory and joyous way. You can also suggest that your son-in-law learn more about Judaism in a more formal way such as an adult education class. Once he knows more about the religion he may consider talking with a rabbi about conversion. The most important thing for this family is that are supportive and encouraging rather than dogmatic in approach, and make it easy for them to remain connected to the Jewish community.

For someone thinking about the possibility of conversion, Lena Romanoff's book, *Your People, My People* might be of interest.
