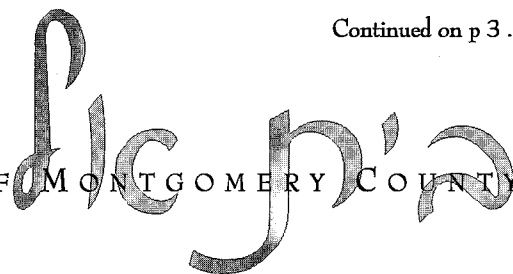


Mark Your Social Action Calendars: Mitzvah Day is November 8

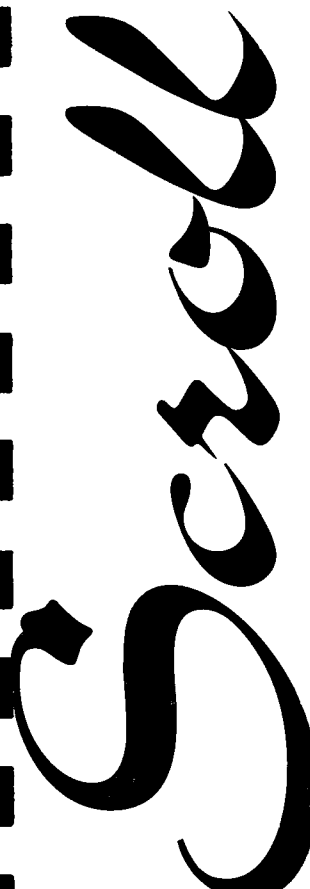

The Legacy: A Group Sharing for Children of Survivors

Attention has been focused in recent years on the impact of Holocaust-related issues on the children of survivors, their relationships with their parents, and their view of the world and their roles in it. Dr. David Mermelstein, a clinical psychologist and himself a child of survivors, and Rabbi William D. Rudolph are offering a three hour group for children of survivors on Sunday, October 25, from 2 - 5 p.m. at Beth El. The focus of the group will be on the emerging reality of the dying off of our parents and other relatives whose experiences with the Holocaust have profoundly touched our lives and in part defined who we are as people. Through mutual sharing, we hope to explore with each other the legacy of our parents' experiences on us as individuals and to recognize the positive and negative aspects of that legacy on our lives.
