

Adult B'nai Mitzvah to be Celebrated at Beth El on October 31

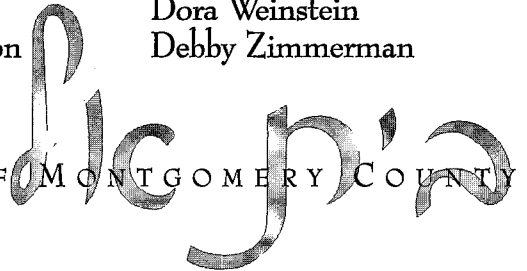

Havdallah at Home

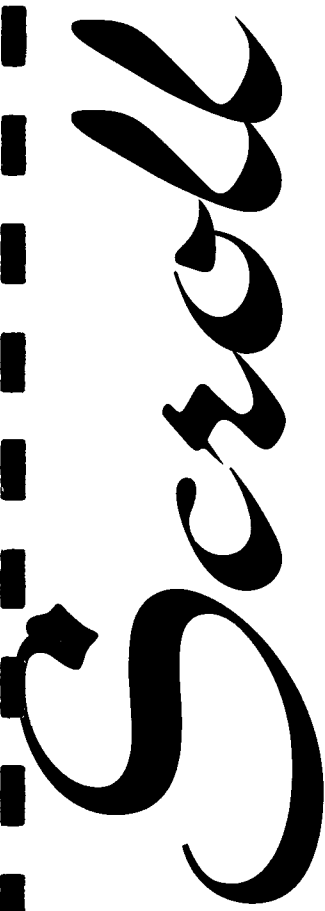

Member of Knesset Visits Beth El

On the weekend of September 11 - 12, Beth El and three of its families hosted Member of Knesset (MK) Rafi Elul and his family. Mr. Elul was here as part of a small MK delegation sponsored by Mercaz, the Zionist arm of the Conservative Movement, to observe Conservative Judaism in the U.S. and be more informed on the pluralism issue in the Diaspora. Each of the three MK's spent a weekend with a different Conservative congregation. Mr. Elul received an aliyah, spoke to the congregation and answered questions at the Kiddush. A very personable and open-minded individual who puts on tefilin every day, Mr. Elul was born in Morocco in 1957 and emigrated to Israel in 1961. He has an AB degree from Bar Ilan and an MBA from Ben Gurion. He was the former mayor of Mayheret Batya and has served in the Knesset since 1992. He is married and has two sons, Ron, 13, and Zev, 10, who attended services with him at Beth El.
