### Upper School

Tuesday, May 25 was the last evening for the 1998-1999 Upper School program. It has been an incredible year in which we reached an enrollment of 100 students. Our core curriculum continues to be well received by the students, the electives provide a vibrant dynamic to the program, and Take 30 continues to provide a forum for exploring contemporary issues as a school.

It is said that we will be "blessed through our children." (Bereshit 22:18) To visit our classrooms on a Tuesday evening gives true meaning to that Biblical prophesy. It was always interesting to see students exploring such core subjects as God and Spirituality, cults and comparative religion (8<sup>th</sup> grade), civil rights, human rights, adolescent suicide and Jewish views on war and peace (9<sup>th</sup> grade) and Human Sexuality and Jewish Values (10<sup>th</sup> grade). The students had their own choice in electing to study from a list of options that included the Jewish influence on Hollywood, current events, Yiddish, art and genealogy.

We are fortunate to have attracted an exceptional staff to our school. This year, Liessa Demba, who also holds the title of Israel Quest Director at UJAF, joined our faculty, quickly establishing herself as an exceptional ninth grade teacher. She joined our veteran core course teachers Cheryl Kreiser (8<sup>th</sup> grade), Marlene Sandberg (8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grades) and Sheldon Novek (10<sup>th</sup> grade). We are especially lucky to have brought together an imaginative team to present electives classes. Rachel Sternberg brought to life the idea of a debate class in the Fall semester, and then scored another victory presenting Jews, Judaism and

Hollywood to more than 30 Spring semester students. (Rachel will be missed, as she is moving to Dallas this summer.) Donna Saady presented an arts and crafts class that combined the study of Jewish ritual objects with the creative process. Betsy Roth, most popular for her Intercession elective Middle Eastern Dance Culture, attracted a dedicated following for A Bissele Yiddish, a class that counts (eins, tvei, drei...), sings and converses in the mamma loshen. Sheldon Novek also presented a popular new option, Jewish Genealogy. Suzin Glickman's current events class, And That's The News, continues to attract a serious following.

Congratulations to the Confirmation Class of 1999-5759. This year's class did an excellent job in their participation in the Shavuot service. **Rebecca Eisen** showed great insight in introducing the Book of Ruth, which was then chanted by **Joshua Rosenbloom**, the first Confirmant in recent memory to read this challenging portion. ### OR DO-IT-YOURSELF INSTRUCTIONS

### ORDER EARLY THIS YEAR!



Sukkot begins this year on Friday night, September 24th. For the twelfth year Congregation Beth El is offering an easy-to-assemble, moderately priced Sukkah kit to enhance your enjoyment of the holiday.

The complete kit will produce a free-standing 8' x 8' x 8' square frame Sukkah made of #2 spruce. All necessary holes are pre-drilled and hardware (bolts, wing nuts, corner braces) and directions for assembly are included. Tools required are pliers, wrench, or nutdriver. You will need to provide your own siding (such as sheets, shades, or plastic), roofing branches, and decorations. A 4' x 8' extension kit is available to enlarge the sukkah to 8' x 12'.

Pictures of the assembled Sukkah can be seen on the synagogue bulletin board near the office and in the Nursery School Hall. The Sukkah put up by the Nursery School is from a Beth El kit.

**THE COST OF EACH COMPLETE KIT IS \$100** (which covers the cost of materials and a contribution to the synagogue). A limited number of kits are made during the summer and will be sold to the first people from whom we receive payment. **MAIL IN YOUR ORDER SOON TO AVOID DISAPPOINTMENT SINCE WE ARE EXPECTING THE KITS TO SELL OUT AGAIN THIS YEAR.**
